### CONTINUED...

So the Christian school leader is the School Principal. At the same time, and as the Bible says in terms of a teacher and a student relationship, "A leader cannot rise above the Board, and the Board cannot rise above its leader."

We consistently hear school leaders say that the role of the Christian school leader has changed dramatically over the past decade and that the expectations of Boards have changed, and priorities have shifted. This paper seeks to stimulate thought and create conversation so that School Board and Principal understand their respective roles, complement each other and serve well together. The purpose of this paper is not to answer every question or to suggest that any individual can be or can do all things. Neither is it intended to suggest that the prioritizing of characteristics will be the same for every Board or School community.

We seek to glorify God in all that we do. The school leader can not be all things to all people. No one person can possibly exemplify every desired characteristic. It must be recognized that grace and opportunity for growth are necessary in communities.

Visitors, sometimes, tell me 'I like the feeling of this place.' I agree with them and with the Australian Secondary Principals Association's comments in the Australian Newspaper, January 14-14, 2017 page 39 Education professional.

"The best schools in Australia are those where a person can walk in and feel a positive vibe, which comes down to collaborative leadership...you can tell by the students, by the teachers, by the atmosphere in the school,...it is the conversation you have with the staff, with the parents, with the students as you go in; you know when they're performing well that it is a good school."

Of course, we know quite well that it is the work and the ministry of Jesus Christ working in the school.




