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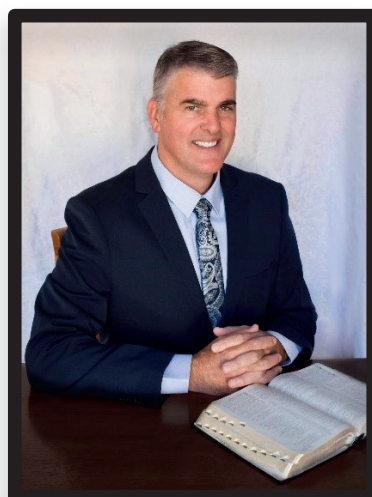
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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE


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Principal's Message continued

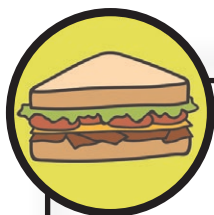
environment of acceptance. Our God is multicultural – we know this because we are His and his love is shared in many diverse languages.
