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### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

2020 has been a significant year for Emmanuel Christian Community School. Not only did we have to endure a worldwide COVID-19 pandemic and all the disruption to a normal school year that it caused, but we became a Kindergarten to Year 12 school for the very first time with our first Year 12 class graduating. Emmanuel 'came of age', we grew up, we matured into a full educational journey for the first time in our 38 year history. This is



both exciting and humbling as we honour our faithful founding fathers from Girrawheen Baptist Church. Without their faith and trust in God we would not be flourishing like we are today.

The apostle Paul talks about 'growing up' in our faith to spiritual maturity. "When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put the ways of childhood behind me." (1 Corinth 13:11)

One way we 'grow up' spiritually is to trust in God's word. To try and live a life by putting its teachings into practice.

In my Graduation speech to the Year 12's I encouraged them to trust in a firm foundation, to ensure they place their confidence in what is strong, what will last, what is unshakable.

The book of Matthew, Chapter 7 records a story that Jesus told:

#### Principal's Message continued

24 "Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. <sup>25</sup> The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house; yet it did not fall, because it had its foundation on the rock. <sup>26</sup> But everyone who hears these words of mine and does not put them into practice is like a foolish man who built his house on sand. 27 The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell with a great crash."

We can have confidence and place our hope on Jesus Christ. Our personal journey's will have highs and lows – even worldwide pandemics to contend with! But Christ will not shift - no matter what. We can expect great things when our hope is built on God's Word.

James also had a lot to say about practicing what the Bible teaches. The first chapter of the book of James concludes with three examples of how we can know that we have been effectively putting God's Word into practice:

- We will have a controlled mouth: "Those who consider themselves religious and yet do not keep a tight rein on their tongues deceive themselves, and their religion is worthless" (James 1:26 NIV).
- 2. We will have a caring heart: "Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans

and widows in their distress" (James 1:27 NIV).

 We will have a clean mind: "keep oneself from being polluted by the world" (James 1:27 NIV). Those things, James tells us, are evidence of genuine Christianity.

In John 13:7 Jesus tells his followers: *"Now that you know these things, you will be blessed if you do them"* (NIV).

The blessings of the Bible come when we put its teachings into practice.



#### NAIDOC DAY



On Tuesday, 10th November, we were very fortunate to have one of our own Emmanuel students come and do the Acknowledgment of Country for a non elder for a whole school assembly. Denzel Humphries is an outstanding young Noongar man from our school in year ten! He spoke with passion and enthusiasm as he delivered the Welcome in Noongar language. We couldn't understand the words, but we could understand his actions and the heart of his message to us – we are welcome on the land of his ancestors. We were reminded that NAIDOC stands for National Aboriginal Islander Day Observance Committee and 2020 has the motto



of: "Always Was, Always Will Be". This draws our attention to the fact that Australia was visited by seafarers many times throughout history prior European to settlement and that people groups engaged with them, voiding the claim of "Terra Nullius".

The Bush Tucker Garden was introduced to us and we were all invited to go and inspect it. Posters of the different plants there are displayed with information for anyone who may not have had the time to visit it yet. Every class watched a PowerPoint about foods local to the area before touring the garden. All the



plants are native to this area and are therefore suitable for our soil and climate. Traditional Indigenous life relied heavily on eating food to maintain health and harvesting the fruit and plants of the season. We are currently in Kambarang, also known as the second spring and the season of birth. Many animals are hatched or born in this time. Foods that we have planted are:

- Old Man Saltbush (delicious wrapping for meats)
- Berry Saltbush (yummy, crisp, red berries)
- Yam (similar to potatoes)
- Finger Limes (the inside is like tiny, lemony pearls of deliciousness)
- Youlk (the roots can be harvested and are a mouthful of golden crunch)

- Sea Celery (similar to the celery in the shop, except a natural Australian plant – so much better for the soil)
- Lilly Pilly we have two different trees, both yielding berries for jam making

We are grateful to live on the beautiful island of Australia. We are blessed with having had generations of Indigenous caretakers of the land, who have nurtured it. The local people did not just survive here, they thrived in an environment rich in culture, history and tradition. We know the Noongar people stand alongside the hundreds of other First Nations cultures of the land we call Australia and live in kinship.

We pray for the land of Australia, the Indigenous people, and the guests, like me, who call this country home. We are from many nations, standing under this luminescent sky honouring and showing respect to God, our king and our Lord. Let your ways be known to us. Help us to have humble hearts and remember that nothing we have is our own for every good and perfect gift comes from you, Lord. We are truly grateful for the Indigenous heritage of our land and pray your peace and prosperity upon your people. Amen.


Three key areas I would like to share with you from the survey are: response to the COVID-19 pandemic, overall student well-being and what you as parents and guardians appreciate most about ECCS.

#### **COVID-19 Response**

As the world continues to deal with the effects of COVID-19, we have been very blessed by our community response to state-wide restrictions. At Emmanuel, we needed to respond quickly and flexibly to provide the best care and continuity for both our staff and our students. Our Crisis Management Team met daily throughout the worst of our state crisis and we responded with prompt and decisive action.

- 98% of parents and guardians overall agreed ECCS responded well to the pandemic.
- Overall positive response to communications received during lockdown, that the school is maintaining hygiene and safety protocols and an elevated level of confidence that the school will manage well should we be required to return to home-schooling.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank and commend all our teachers, staff, students and parents & guardians in how we all came together to respond to this challenge.

#### Student Wellbeing

Considering the above and an ongoing priority for ECCS is student wellbeing and safety.

- Parents and Guardians say that 92% of students feel safe and happy at school.

#### School Action Plans

- 1. Improve communication to families. We for 2021 to be able to give better more timely communication to parents. We have already increased the frequency of the newsletter and all events for 2021 have been calendarized.
- Improve in our community engagement. With the launching of the Emmanuel Parent and Friends as well as the employment of a Community Engagement Officer for 2021 – Mrs. Belinda Cheung.
- Improving and consolidating our curriculum delivery and standard. This has already started this year with the introduction of our Deputies of Curriculum, Mrs. Pinky Street (Primary) and Mrs. Bronwyn Carruthers (Secondary). New curriculum programs have been introduced as well as new subjects. We aim to consolidate these school improvement initiatives in 2021.

I look forward to other opportunities where we can share other results in future occasions. Again, I would like to thank you for your feedback, please do not hesitate to speak to myself or any of the Leadership and I look forward to working closely with you to make 2021 a better year for ECCS.




#### **STUDENT SAFETY**


