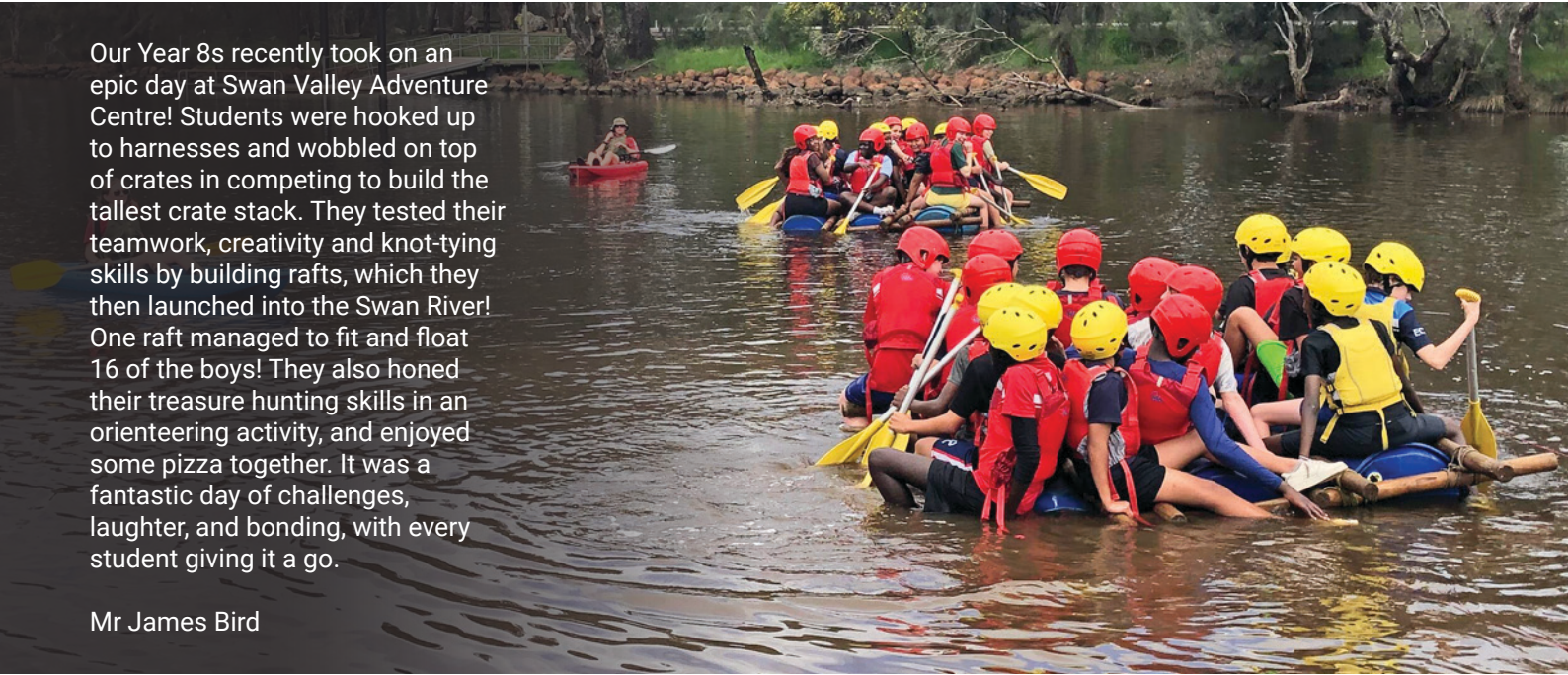




YEAR 8 ACTION-ADVENTURE DAY

YEAR 9 RITES OF PASSAGE CAMP

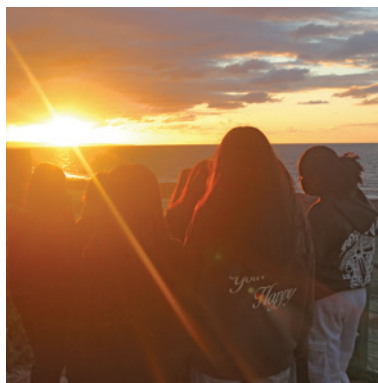

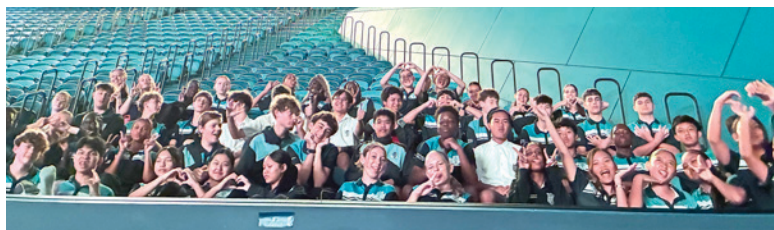

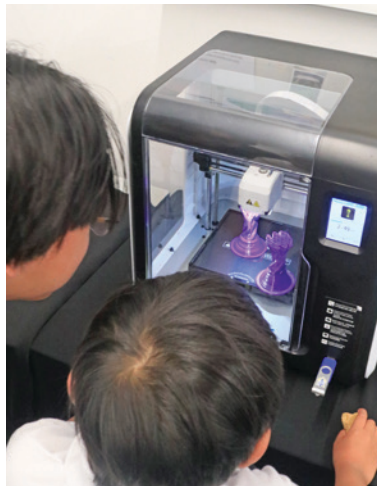
ART & TECH EXPO
